WHO SHOULD TAKE THIS COURSE?

- How to measure the performance of health and safety in the workplace.

Measuring performance	 How to evaluate and monitor the health and safety performance of an organisation to ensure safety standards are maintained. What key performance indicators (KPIs) to measure.
